So pull on the control surface, check the hinging, sometimes you can catch that failing hinge before the wind does when you are in the air.

As I have said before, it's a great way to make a new friend, spotting for a new flyer and holding the aircraft while it is being started are just a couple of ways to combine safety and consideration. We are a fixed wing club so heli's have to conform to the pattern when flying with fixed wings but why not sit out a flight and watch some of great helicopter pilots do their thing without having to worry about fixed wings.
