The major advantage, of course, is that if your club is visible in its efforts to provide something of value to the community, the community will be there to support the club when that time comes-and at some point it will. We often hear from a club that is on the verge of losing a flying site. Our first response is always, "Tell us about your involvement in your community." If the club reports that it is not involved, or that it has been thinking about getting involved, then it's almost always too late. Parents like it when someone does good things for their children. We've seen club after club that conduct community outreach programs. Clubs that are active in their communities have received support from friends and neighbors when it was needed and it was the result of the club being active in its community. If your club is thinking about developing a community outreach program, or is considering enhancing what it's already doing, a good source of information can be found on the AMA Education website at www.arnaflightschool.org. There you will find information and ideas about a number of programs from simple one-day model builds to more complex, multi-week programs. Give it some thought and if you think you'd like to create a program for your club, visit our Flight School website or call the Education department at AMA Headquarters. The staff would be happy to help.
